I understand that the University Place Neighborhood Association, along with Manatee County, require that all residential lots have at least one (1) street tree, defined as a tree planted within 25' of the right of way (curb) of the frontage of single-family homes, as well as one (1) additional street tree if the home is located on a corner lot. If the removal of this tree leaves the lot without the required tree, a replacement tree(s) must be planted to satisfy the requirements of both the UPNA as well as Manatee County. *The replacement tree(s) do not have to be planted in the same location as the tree removed.*

Palms: Canopy trees are preferred. In instances where a canopy tree is not suitable due to established landscaping, two (2) palm trees may be planted to satisfy the street tree requirement. Palms must have a minimum overall height of 15' at planting. Qualifying palms include:
